REMOTE LEARNING

We have had some children off school with symptoms of COVID19. Luckily, we have had no positive cases. It is required now in law that anyone self-isolating either through a positive case or awaiting test results should continue their education at home through Remote Learning provided by the school. Our new Chromebooks have arrived and they are being loaned out to certain families the staff have identified as being able to benefit from having them (this could be due to having older siblings taking up computer time or for other reasons). All work (except for Triscombe

class) should be done online in Google Classroom. We will set out more details about this but the main expectations are:

1. Work should be for at least **3 hours per day**
2. Remote Learning should be done to the same high standards as we have at school (good presentation, care taken with it)
3. Any remote learning packs are to be brought back upon your child's return to school
4. A requirement to meet deadlines set by teachers
5. Your family bubble should NOT be seen out and about whilst self-isolating. This is now against the law and can incur big fines.

We appreciate that switching like this can be very challenging but please know that our teachers are working extremely hard to ensure work is provided and then for children to 'slot back in' upon their arrival. This is such a challenge for teachers to do and so if you don't understand something about Remote Learning, then please do contact us at the school.

TUTORING NEXT TERM

You may have read that a National Tutoring Programme has started to address the inevitable gaps that emerged due to the six-month lockdown period. We have decided to engage with this programme. We are in the process of being matched with private tutors and teachers will be in touch with certain families about engaging with this. The sessions will be for a 15-hour block of 1 or 2 hours after school and are for children we deem require it. **There will be no cost to you.** This is being paid for by the government. All we ask is if you choose to engage with this that you are reliable with attendance at these sessions. They will be in the school building and start when the risk assessment allows for this to happen. Our current thinking is that this would start in February at the earliest or if Somerset's tier rating improves then in January. The sessions will be face-to-face, supervised by a member of staff and all Private Tutors are DBS-checked and qualified teachers. The tutors will ensure correct distancing and follow the measures set out in our risk assessment. Teachers will start to have phone chats with you to gauge interest but further details will be announced at the end of term. We really hope you take up this offer.

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CORONAVIRUS INCUBATION TIMELINES:

Highlighting different situations, please see below the timelines that we have received from NHS England, this is in the help to protect and keep us all safe.

Coronavirus Incubation Timeline

It can take up to 14 days to develop symptoms after coming into close contact with a case of covid-19 - this is called the incubation period.



- December 13**
Harry was a close contact of someone confirmed with covid-19 (Harry must immediately self isolate for 14 days)
- December 18**
Harry doesn't self isolate and instead gets a test. The test is negative. (This is wrong. He had no symptoms and should not have got a test. He could still be incubating the virus so should self-isolate for 14 days despite the negative test result)
- December 20**
Thinking he didn't have coronavirus, Harry went to the pub with five other people. They shared a table for four hours.
- December 22**
Harry developed symptoms and tested positive. He was contagious for 48 hours before his symptoms started (known as asymptomatic) and exposed five people to coronavirus. These five people must now self-isolate for 14 days.

They are all in self-isolation over Christmas

If you are a close contact of someone with coronavirus, you MUST complete your full isolation period, even if you feel well



Coronavirus Incubation Timeline

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- December 18**
Jane was a close contact of someone confirmed with covid-19 (Jane must immediately self isolate for 14 days)
- December 20**
Jane is bored of self-isolating and feels fine so gets a test which is negative. (This is wrong. She had no symptoms and should not have got a test. She could still be incubating the virus so should self-isolate for 14 days despite the negative test result)
- December 25**
Thinking she didn't have coronavirus, Jane spent Christmas day with her extended family bubble of 12 people. Her Aunt is having chemotherapy for Breast Cancer and is clinically extremely vulnerable (CEV)
- December 27**
Jane developed symptoms and tested positive. She was contagious for 48 hours before her symptoms started (known as asymptomatic) and exposed 12 people to coronavirus. They must all now self-isolate for 14 days.

Jane feels better after a few days, but her Aunt becomes extremely unwell and is taken to hospital where she is placed in the Intensive Care Unit.

If you are a close contact of someone with coronavirus, you MUST complete your full isolation period, even if you feel well
