I would like to give a shout out to our staff. They are an incredible bunch really. Our Early Years staff have worked so amazingly to continue provision for our youngest learners, keeping the school a place of normality when in fact, these aren't normal times! There has been much criticism of school staff in the media and it is totally unjustified in my opinion. Our staff work incredibly hard and it shows in our remote learning offer. We are always working to improve things and the work that is done behind the scenes by the teachers planning, chasing up work, creating content is very demanding and even more so when they have to come in to run the school bubble on rota. I am so grateful to them and their efforts. Our support staff are working industriously to support children with their reading, having sessions on the phone or on video call. This work is so important and I am so grateful to them.

I saw a letter sent out by a Head of another school elsewhere in the country in which his community had been critical of efforts with remote learning. His response was to signpost these 'critics' to signing up to become teachers themselves, if they think they can do a better job. Although, I found this to be 'interesting', it did make me appreciate how supportive our community is and how I don't think we'd find ourselves in that situation! We work so well together to celebrate when things are going well but also to communicate politely when things aren't going so well. At Stogursey, our relentless drive to improve and our kinder approach means that we can grow in everything we do, including meeting these challenges right now.


