After an initial dip in November, we are once again picking up on our attendance. If your child is



## OUR PRIORITIES IN FOCUS- RELATIONSHIPS, SOCIAL & HEALTH EDUCATION (RSHE)



Each month, we will look at one of the 4 priorities for this year to show what we are working on. We felt following our new vision of 'Grow in the Grace and knowledge' our curriculum did not reflect this vision and so our improvement work focuses on this. So far this term for RSHE, we have...

- Trained teachers in Diversity themes and textbased lessons on families
- Started to introduce themes on protected characteristics in the Equality Act (2010) such

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as LGBT families, age and disability discrimination

- Re-evaluated our RSHE curriculum and secured funding for this to be developed to reflect our needs as a community
- Started up in-house mental health provision for those who might need it using our qualified staff to do so.

This is just the beginning of what we intend to achieve. A visitor to our school recently said how forward-thinking we seem. Preparing children for life in Modern Britain is more than just English and Maths results. Employers look for so-called 'soft skills' and we believe emotional and social skills should be developed from the off and based on good evidence. This is what we are doing.

#### **TUTORING**

This is coming to an end and has been largely successful. The children say that they've enjoyed benefitting from these sessions. In the Spring Term, we will complete these and then move toward the final tranche of school-based tutoring for a small minority of pupils who may still require this.
