Welcome to this month's edition of the newsletter. I hope you are enjoying the gradual lifting of restrictions. I am really hopeful that with the vaccination rollout being so successful, some sort of normality will resume from next month for us all. The children continue to astonish me with their work ethic and enjoyment of learning in our school. I thought I would use this month's newsletter to outline how we are doing our bit for the recovery and continuing to change the school, reflecting the new vision the governors and the Trust have set us to achieve.

The other day, I felt so proud to be the Head of Stogursey when I was listening to children talking about their learning. Year 4/5/6 have been writing formal letters to ask for more funding for their play. They obviously want this to be a huge success and care deeply about it. I could see this in their writing. I enjoyed pretending to be a concerned dog owner in the role play corner as Ava was role-playing at being a vet. She took good care of my sick pet and only charged 10p for it! It was delightful having birthday cakes being made for me in Pre-school with pretend candles on (it wasn't my birthday!) but the youngest learners were counting the candles before singing me Happy Birthday! The very next day, it was delightful meeting newborn children and toddlers and their Mums doing a messy play session. I didn't stay for this but will do next time! My thanks to Lianne in preschool who has volunteered to run this provision. It has already had a great response and I'm looking forward to how this develops. Our Year 2/3 class has been really enthusiastic in my outdoor assemblies talking about communities that they belong to. It is so nice to see children at all ages getting back into their learning and putting the pandemic behind them.

As we grow in what we offer and what we do, it is nice to mention the staff as well. I have seen how the teachers have made the transition back to classroom teaching from remote learning and having brilliant discussions about planning and children's work. It is great to see Mrs Payne and Mrs French using their training in mental health and speech and language to massively benefit our children's recovery. It is also fab to see the outdoor areas being improved by the Early Years Team as they grow in what they learn from their courses. There is definitely a positive, 'can-do' atmosphere in school and our work in our school is getting noticed. I have had guite a few enguiries about families wanting to move children to our school. This is obviously brilliant news and makes for a bright future!

Children have struggled a little with the social aspects in unstructured times as is the case in every school following the huge disruptions. We have made it our mission to support our children in gaining the important life skills of developing and sustaining friendships, conflict resolution, and using the outdoors for developing strong mental health. I have been out playing games as have other members of staff and the children have responded really well to this. Children get on and fall out all the time and this is normal. I don't know of any siblings who haven't ever fallen out. It is our job as a school to use these moments as important learning points. Previously, schools would just focus on academic learning whereas our vision at Stogursey is more about academic and non-academic things. We want children to learn how to get on with each other, develop friendships, manage feelings well and handle conflict. This is a work in progress and next year, our mental health lead Miss May will have completed her extensive training on this and would have started some really visionary work on mental health that will benefit everyone. You should notice a real change.

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As ever, if you wish to chat, I'm usually on the gate daily, pop in or arrange an appointment if you wish to discuss something or lend your time to our school. We are so pleased to have volunteers back so please get in touch if there's something you can help us with.

Thanks also must go the West Somerset Opportunity Area who subsidised places. We are finalising the application for the Summer Club, where we hope to make greater use of Kilve Court. The children enjoyed their day there so we will make use of it. West Somerset Opportunity are will continue the subsidy until this time next year so please make the most of it. If you want a discount on fees, please approach Mr Tucker when the time comes. The OA also wish to fund trips to exciting places as well so this should really make the Holiday Club varied and not to be missed! This time round there should be up to 4 weeks of sessions, 4 days a week.

On a separate but related note, we are now applying for funding to create a 'Happiness Breakfast Club' and 'Happiness After School Club'. We will keep you updated on its progress but if we are successful, this will be a huge asset to our school and I hope parents/ carers will support it by sending their children to it.
