This is achieved by working collaboratively to grow children and adults alike in wisdom, confidence and enjoyment of life and learning.

We focus on developing knowledge and skills year on year, alongside continual personal growth to expand horizons and connect positively with all in our community.





Knowledge and experience first

Our curriculum recognises that not all children have access to enriching experiences that are essential for succeeding in education. We plan for this through visiting guest speakers, termly trips and in-school experiences. This is all properly mapped-out and sequenced so that everything builds and makes sense.

Countries with knowledge curricula outperform those that do not. We are keen to ensure that the substance of what is known as well as experienced at our school comes first.

Exciting enrichment opportunities come as standard at our school. We are so proud of our Happiness Breakfast After School and Holiday Clubs! Children prepare their own food at these clubs and take part in physical activities including adventurous outdoor learning as well as gardening and yoga.

Each week in our Adventurers' Programme, children learn a range of skills that build towards an exciting annual expedition. Within this programme, they have been learning:

- First Aid
- Cookery
- Shelter building
- Map reading
- Survival skills



Academic rigour is the norm

Our results have been steadily improving year-on-year and we are proud of this achievement. We have high expectations of all our children and through our **small steps curriculum**, we believe that all can achieve, no matter what.

We expect a lot, but achieve this in a fun, caring way. Teachers are highly-skilled and work collaboratively with each other as well as with partner schools in the trust to achieve the academic rigour that is required.

Reading is fundamental to all learning and we place great emphasis on this. Our aim is to turn every child into an avid, passionate reader and ensure no child is left behind.

We don't do fads at Stogursey but instead base educational decisions on evidence and research and whether it would meet the vision for our school- will this help our children to grow? If the answer is no, then we simply don't do it.

Our curriculum is delivered in **small steps**, with children achieving mastery in all areas. Cognitive science shows us that this is the best way to learn, so as not to overwhelm children and help them to remember and build on what came before. We are a Maths Mastery school, having had a huge investment in training and resources by being in the West Somerset Opportunity Area. This approach is now being employed across our curriculum.

Discipline balanced with wellbeing

Our easy-to-understand behaviour policy helps children to succeed. Any incidents of bullying are few and far between but are always investigated. 100% of our families have been happy with the school's actions. Children regularly report that they feel 'happy' and 'safe' in our school and we always listen to children through pupil voice activities in and out of class.

What makes our school such a lovely place to be is that everyone knows what is expected of them and we coach children when they fall short of the expected standards of behaviour. Research shows this is more effective. Since using this approach, incidents of inappropriate behaviour have significantly decreased.

Our Trauma-Informed approach

means all staff are able to co-regulate with children to help them make sense of situations and work with them to develop this critical life skill. Our Relationships Social and Health Education (RSHE) curriculum is visionary and is the main tool we use to help children successfully develop strong mental health and build an excellent, happy future for themselves.

Our Pre-School is set up with quality classroom resources and well-equipped and extensive outdoor play areas, which are carefully matched to a young child's needs and developmental stages.

We focus on seven key areas of learning and development:

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Mathematics
- Literacy
- Expressive Arts and Design
- Understanding the World

Children enjoy a range of activities and experiences which take into account their interests and individual needs and develop their physical, intellectual, emotional and social abilities. We celebrate and value their achievements.

Outside we share with the primary school a safe, secure grassed area and a dedicated pre-school playgound. We regard outdoor play as an integral part of our curriculum and provide a welcoming and caring atmosphere in a beautiful stimulating environment with practitioners who are dedicated to your child's development.



A close-knit community

Stogursey Village is well-known as a close-knit community. The village loves its school and we love the village! In recent years, members of the community have stepped up to join in with day to day school life and our children and staff are always happy to take part in local community events.

Parents volunteer through FOSS (Friends of Stogursey School) fundraising for trips or helping us directly make improvements to our school. Some parents have even volunteered their skills and talents to spruce up and improve areas around the school site such as the playgound and gardens. With their help our school looks fantastic!
