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COVID Risk Assessment

This has been updated in line with recent changes. The omicron variant is spreading rapidly and when we get positive cases, we follow the measures in our risk assessment. Unfortunately, for GDPR reasons we cannot disclose who has got it and whether your child is a close contact of the positive case(s). This is because NHS Test and Trace took control of contact tracing from schools a while ago. You should be notified by them if your child is a close contact and then a daily Lateral Flow Test is 'strongly advised' for a 7 day period. Keeping children off school is not an option unless they are positive themselves. A confirmatory PCR test is no longer required. If you are concerned that your child may have been a close contact and you have not been notified by Test and Trace, then all we can advise is to keep taking Lateral Flow Tests regularly and still attend school. We will provide remote learning for children self-isolating if they are well enough to do this. For most, this new variant has very mild symptoms. We won't provide remote learning for those being kept off school unauthorised and this may even trigger safeguarding procedures.

As school staff, we have to operate within the guidance we are given by the DfE. Thank you for your cooperation.

OUR PRIORITIES IN FOCUS- READING, PHONICS AND SPELLING





Each month, we will look at one of the 4 priorities for this year to show what we are working on. We felt following our new vision of 'Grow in the Grace and knowledge' our curriculum did not reflect this vision and so our improvement work focuses on this. So far this term for Reading, phonics and spelling we have...

- Trained teachers and support staff in how to deliver high quality phonics and spelling sessions
- Given extra reading with an adult to those children who might need it
- Started to revamp our library
- Bought more books than ever!
- Integrated reading into our other subjects
- Brought back reading for pleasure sessions including Hot Chocolate Fridays
- Altered our reading books to match up with the phonics scheme so younger children get to practise reading at home and achieve quicker success with what is a fundamental life skill.

We have more exciting things planned, including ...

- Inviting authors to talk about their experiences as a writer;
- Creating more class books (written by the children) to add to our ever-growing library;
- Receiving more furniture to improve our library and provide more shelving for books;
